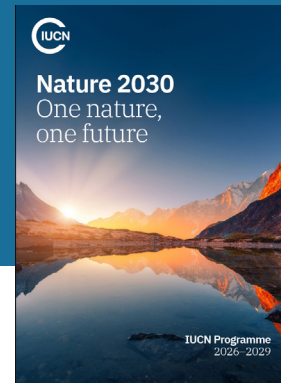

About the IUCN 2026-2029 Programme of Work

The IUCN 2026–2029 Programme of Work, adopted by Members at the 2025 World Conservation Congress, emphasizes scaling up inclusive and socially just conservation across land, freshwater, and marine ecosystems, while addressing the drivers of biodiversity loss through transformation in key sectors. It places **people at the centre of nature protection** by valuing the knowledge and leadership of Indigenous peoples, local communities, women, and youth, and by ensuring that conservation efforts uphold human rights.

The Nature 2030 IUCN Programme recognises that transformative conservation outcomes will only be possible if people, societies and economies are re-connected with nature.

About #NatureForAll

[#NatureForAll](#) is a global movement launched in 2016 by the IUCN Commission on Education and Communication (IUCN CEC), World Commission on Protected Areas (IUCN WCPA) and a coalition of partners to inspire love, support, and positive action for nature. It was created on the understanding that **people protect what they care about**, and that **fostering meaningful experiences in nature is essential to building a culture of conservation**. Over the years, through critical funding and staffing provided by Parks Canada and other core partners, #NatureForAll has grown into a [diverse network of over 640 organizations](#) working together to share knowledge, stories, and solutions that help more people connect with and care for the natural world.

#NatureForAll advances IUCN's Programme of Work

#NatureForAll supports the IUCN 2026–2029 Programme of Work by inspiring broader public engagement and fostering lifelong connections with nature, helping build the societal support needed for inclusive and just conservation. Its explicit focus on reducing barriers is a strong alignment with IUCN's focus on inclusive access, inter-generational equity, and respect for diverse cultures and knowledge systems. #NatureForAll can amplify the voices and leadership of Indigenous peoples, local communities, women, girls, and youth by sharing their stories, knowledge, and solutions across global platforms. Through partnerships, outreach, and education, #NatureForAll can also strengthen protection for environmental and human-rights defenders by raising awareness and mobilizing collective action.

Fostering culture and youth engagement Pg 52	<p>#NatureForAll provides a proven global platform for youth-led nature engagement, intergenerational collaboration (e.g., #NatureForAll partners were major contributors to the 2021 IUCN Global Youth Summit), and culturally-rooted experiences. Through storytelling tools, partner-driven campaigns, and a focus on equitable access, it reinforces inclusive conservation leadership and fosters a lifelong love of nature essential for transforming societal behaviours.</p>
Facilitating Nature-based Education Pg 53	<p>#NatureForAll strengthens IUCN's ability to mainstream Nature-based Education globally by curating innovations, sharing best practices across its 600+ partner network, and enabling measurable behaviour change through nature-connected learning and public engagement. Promoting one health Pg 64	<p>#NatureForAll promotes the concept that a healthy environment means healthy people. #NatureForAll encourages One Health through connection with nature, a potential public health strategy that is accessible and affordable for many populations, with research demonstrating not only protective values but restorative benefits as well. #NatureForAll shares resources that promote the health benefits of spending time connecting with nature. Work related to Motion 128 aligns with the One Health approach, and many tools and resources created by partners do so as well.</p>
Promoting nature-based urban development Pg 67	<p>We live in a period of increased global urbanization, pressing climate change challenges, increasing health inequities, decreasing biodiversity, higher rates of mental health problems, and rise in communicable and non-communicable diseases. The need for regular contact with nature has never been greater. #NatureForAll offers opportunities for partners to share resources, stories and successes that can help others connect with nature in urban areas. By using the #NatureForAll platforms, organisations can inspire others by the work they are doing and share their knowledge.</p>
Integrating nature into scaled-up global climate policy and action Pg 70	<p>By emphasising nature's role in health, resilience and everyday life, #NatureforAll increases public acceptance of nature-based climate solutions and climate-compatible behaviours (green cities, low-carbon lifestyles, etc.).</p>
Scaling up Nature-based Solutions Pg 72	<p>By creating social license and public demand for nature-based solutions on land, in freshwater and in the ocean, #NatureForAll helps the Union deliver conservation and climate outputs at scale under Nature 2030. #NatureForAll serves as a platform to allow partners to share solutions and initiatives that connect people to nature for positive behaviour change and conservation impact.</p>
